PHYSICAL COMEDY

Farce relies on physical comedy like chases, slamming doors, funny falls, and big physical reactions. They add to and often escalate the chaos (and the laughter).



FAST PACE

People in farces talk fast, move fast, and act fast. It definitely adds to the sense of urgency, and definitely leads to more confusion among the characters.

CONFUSION

Speaking of confusion, farces are full of misunderstandings, disguises, and mistaken identities. There are moments when the only people who know what's really going on is the audience.



STOCK

Characters in farce are over-thetop and built on recognizable types. Audiences are in on the joke: they recognize the bit and anticipate their actions - which are usually exaggerated.
